For your Board of Directors Meeting, I have listed an outline of our work for the District as follows:

I. Bond Projects

Projects Under Construction:

1. Surface Water Treatment Plant Expansion

Contract Amount = \$4,298,000.00

Status: Actual construction start date July 2025 due to long lead times for treatment units.

2. 2 MG Ground Storage Tank at Plant Site

Contract Amount = \$2,549,400.00

Status: 70% complete

3. 0.5 MG Ground Storage Tank Rehab at Plant Site

Contract Amount = \$568,607.00

Status: Project Complete

4. FM 920 Booster Pump Station Expansion

Contract Amount = \$2,774,500.00

Status: 60% complete

5. 1 MG Ground Storage Tank at FM 920 Booster Pump Station

Contract Amount = \$1,544,000.00

Status: 70% complete

6. FM 51 Booster Pump Station

Contract Amount = \$2,789,300.00

Status: 60% complete

7. 0.5 MG Ground Storage Tank at FM 51 Booster Pump Station

Contract Amount = \$1,292,400.00

Status: 70% complete

8. 0.5 MG Elevated Storage Tank at Thomas Rd. and Johnnie Dr.

Contract Amount = \$2,163,000.00

Status: 20% complete

9. Water Line Between Keeter Elevated Tank and Jaybird Booster Station

Contract Amount = \$7,199,912.79

Status: 80% complete

Total Project Contract Amounts = \$22,629,719.79

Projects in Design Phase:

1. 1.5 MG Ground Storage Tank Partition Curtain

Plans are complete for this project. This project bidding and construction Fall/Winter months when water demand is lowest.

2. FM 51 Elevated Storage Tank

The 1 acre site for this tank has been finalized and is waiting on formal closing. The plans for the tank have been revised based on the new site and are in the final completion stage. Once the land deal is closed the geotechnical engineering group can get on site and do the boring work and issue a geotechnical report. After that the project will be bid.

3. FM 51 16" and 12" Water Lines

This project bid opening was on December 5, 2024. Low Bidder was NAE Enterprises, Inc. with a bid of \$2,053,302.90. The Engineer's Estimate was \$2,781,172.00. We recommend awarding the contract to NAE Enterprises, Inc.

4. 12" Water Line Knob Hill From Jay Bird Ln. to FM 730

The contracts have been executed. Construction is set to begin in early January.

- 5. Three Skillet Rd., Roads Ln & Shady Ln. 12", 8" & 6" Water Lines Survey work is ongoing. We anticipate completing the plans and having this project out for bid close to the beginning of 2025.
- 6. 20" Water Line From FM 920 Booster Pump to Agnes Elevated Storage Tank Survey work is to begin on this project in mid-October. We anticipate completing the plans and having this project out for bid close to the beginning of 2025.

General Managers Report

- Construction on the following projects, from the bond, are underway in some form: -
- 1,000,000 gallon ground storage tank on F.M.920. This tank is complete and waiting to be painted.
- 2,000,000 gallon ground storage tank at the water plant. The tank is complete and sand blasting is underway in preparation for painting.
- 2, 2 million gallons a day filters at the water plant. On order will not come in until around the first of 2025
- Booster plant expansion F.M.920 ties in with 1,000,000 gallon tank at this location and is between 75 and 80 percent complete.
 - South F.M. 51 booster pump station. Construction has started.
- _500,000 gallon storage tank south F.M. 51. Construction is near complete on tank piping is still being installed and the tank is awaiting paint crew.
- Major water line upgrade from Keeter Rd to Jaybird lane consisting of: 27,504' of 16" water line

18,273' of 12" water line

2,052' of 8" water line. This project is 70% complete. Construction was slowed by the Wise County Commissioner and Engineer. The project has been nearly completely stopped awaiting permits from the wise county commissioners court.

_500,000 gallon elevated tank Thomas Rd. Construction has begun.

Construction projects that have been completed from the bond

- Emergency 16" water line upgrade from Jaybird Lane to Veal Station Rd.
- $_$ Upgrade of 300,000 gallon elevated storage tank (Partagas Tank) raising the tank 58' higher
- Emergency repairs to 500,000 gallon clear well at water plant
 - Bids were opened for the
 - 16" water line upgrade in the Agnes area December the 5th.
 - Bids will be taken soon for the 500'000 gallon storage tank to be built South of Veal Station Rd on Melvin Woody's property.
 - Construction will begin around the first of the year on the bond project upgrading lines down Knobhill Rd to FM 730.
- 45 new meters have been set, 67 meters changed out and 116 MIU units have been set since last month's meeting
- The paperwork for the land purchase from Melvin Woody South of Veal Station Rd on FM 51 is being looked over by MR. Woody's lawyer/land manager. A land contract is being put together and the land purchase should be complete by the end of December.
- Water leaks requiring Boil Water notices since the last meeting are attached.
- On 12/4/24 Jim Cox and myself attended the monthly meeting of the South Wise water district being formed by several entities in Wise County.
